

Fulufjället/Fulufjellet is a mountain area on the Swedish-Norwegian border, in the municipalities of Älvdalen / Malung-Sälen (Dalarne, SE) and Trysil (Hedmark, NO). Naked rock with lichen, grassland, bog, mountain birch areas, and coniferous forest areas in the surronding valleys cover altogether about 600 km², 400 km² on the Swedish side and 200 km² on the Norwegian side. About 80% of Fulufjället/Fulufjellet is protected as national park, 385 km² on the Swedish side and 83 km² on the Norwegian side. See the map below.

QUESTION ABOUT VISITS TO FULUFJÄLLET/FULUFJELLET HERE?

Humans have used the nature in Fulufjället/Fulufjellet for centuries, primarily for hunting-gathering and fishing, in later times also for timber harvesting and outdoor recreation. However, large part of the Fulufjället/Fulufjellet area is little influenced by human activities, with old-growth forest hosting rare and endangered plants, fungi, lichen, as well as bird species (see photo below). A large, coherent protected area is particularly important for larger mammal species that need large habitats.

The larger is the protected nature area of Fulufjället/Fulufjellet, the better preserved are the natural processes and species in it. Splitting of nature habitats with human-induced barriers (buildings, infrastructure, etc.) disturb its structure, and might decrease ecological values and reduce chances for conservation of the natural heritage.

QUESTION ABOUT NATURE / HABITATS ???

Establishing or extending areas under strict conservation, in so-called undisturbed zones, is the best way to preserve Fulufjället/Fulufjellet in its natural state. Undisturbed zones imply leaving nature develop without human intervention into the natural processes. For called undisturbed zones within a national park, a permit would be required for entering, normally only in small, guided groups; and there would be no logging, nor hunting, fishing and picking of berries and mushrooms; and no motor vehicle would enter or fly over the area. Nor would there be any control of bark beetles or deceases affecting plants or animals, only large forest fires would be considered stopped by human intervention.

On the Swedish side of Fulufjället/Fulufjellet national park, 60% of the park is currently under a passive conservation regime, yet 0% of the park on the Norwegian part. See figure below.

Further extension of the national park or undisturbed zones would demand bilateral cooperation between Sweden and Norway and support of citizens of the both countries involved.

On the Swedish side, about 60% of the park is strictly preserved, an undisturbed zone where nature is left on its own. On about 15% of the park, low human activity is allowed, including hiking and seasonal hunt on elk (moose) and small game. On about 25% of the park, high human activity is allowed, including most types of outdoor recreational activities, and in part of this area several facilities for visitors are established. On the Norwegian side, the park is not divided into zones with different protection purposes; but the restrictions are similar as those of the high activity zones on the Swedish park, allowing most types of outdoor recreational activities, including hunting/fishing. However, there are no facilities established for visitors, similar to those on the Swedish side.

The proposed increase of the conservation programme for Fulufjället/Fulufjellet would imply not only additional benefits but also costs. Establishment or increase of undisturbed zones, besides the apparently positive results would also induce considerable limitations on some of the existing local business activities in the areas surrounding Fulufjället/Fulufjellet, possibly leading to reduction of businesses' and local population's income. Therefore, implementation of the suggested conservation measures would require compensation of the costs and lost profits, first of all in terms of the local inhabitants. Taking into account that Fulufjället/Fulufjellet is the natural heritage of the Swedes and the Norwegians, an annual compulsory tax is being suggested for adult citizens of Sweden and Norway. The collected amounts would form the target Swedish-Norwegian Fund for Conservation of Fulufjället/Fulufjellet and would be spent exclusively on the provision of


undisturbed zones of Fulufjället/Fulufjellet in accordance with the adopted conservation programme. The funds would be assigned in order to cover conservation costs as well as the lost profits of local populations due to the more strict protection regime. The Fund would function under the auspices of an international organisation like UNESCO or IUCN.

Below you will be suggested a number of situations in order for you to choose the option of Fulufjället/Fulufjellet conservation programme which you consider the best. Different options emphasise different aspects and imply different level of cost which you would have been had to bear.

Please get to know the programme attributes and their possible levels before you start choosing:





Annual rate of the compulsory tax, every adult Norwegian citizen would have to pay.


The tax will exclusively enter the target Swedish-Norwegian Fund for Conservation of Fulufjället/Fulufjellet and would have totally been spent on the extension of undisturbed zones in accordance with the conservation programme adopted.

FOR INSTANSE, IF IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROGRAMME THE UNDISTURBED ZONE WOULD HAVE BEEN SPATIALLY EXPANDED EXCLUSIVELY ON THE SWEDISH SIDE THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF FUNDS WILL BE SPENT IN SWEDEN, AND VICE VERSA FOR EXCLUSIVE EXPANSION ON THE NORWEGIAN SIDE.

The fund would have functioned under an international organisation, for instance UNESCO or IUCN. Additional conservation costs and lost profits of the local population induced by the undisturbed zone enlargement programme would have to be covered from the Fund.

ONE KRONA/KRONE (KR)¹ FROM THE SWEDISH SIDE WOULD HAVE ENTERED THE FUND IN RESPONSE FOR ONE KRONE PAID BY NORWEGIAN CITIZENS, AND VICE VERSA.

POSSIBLE AMOUNTS (ALTERNATIVES) – KR VALUE IS ABOUT HALF OF ZLOTY:



For the alternatives implying no extension/establishment of undisturbed zones in Fulufjället/Fulufjellet, 0 ha increase (the "status-quo" option), there will be no additional costs and no tax paying to the fund.
